PUBLIC HEARING

Sharon read the public hearing notice. The public hearing was to repeal Section 2 of ordinance 17 regarding the Uniform Building Code and adopt in its place the version of the International Building Code that the state of Idaho uses with the exception that all non-occupied detached buildings under 600 square feet will be exempt from building inspections. Also the purpose of the public hearing was to take comments regarding amending the budget and allowing for spending not exceeding \$20,000 to be taken out of the general account savings to be used to pay for a remodel of the City Office building.

Travis handed out a budget sheet for the remodel. There were no public comments about either issue. Mark motioned to close the public hearing and Ryan seconded. The voting was all in favor.

BUSINESS LICENSE:

Magdalena Workman asked for a business license for her home-based business. She makes historical reproduction clothing and her business is called Thistle Harp Clothing. Mark motioned to approve her business license and Sarah seconded. Voting was all in favor.

PIONEER CELEBRATION:

Janie handed out a schedule of events for the pioneer celebration. Cindee Reeder donated the printing of the event posters. Bill Stewart will give a talk at the flag ceremony. The high school band will do a breakfast fund raiser. The parade will start at 10:00 and games will follow. The grand marshals will be Thom and Tracie Greene. The dunk tank will go from noon-1:00 and Janie is still looking for people to get dunked. Vendors will be set up along first west and around the park. There will be an airplane candy drop at 1:00 followed by animal chases of chickens, rabbits, and a greased pig. Water activities will follow in the afternoon. Travis Johnson will be doing a pig roast for a fundraiser before the shootout and Rough Stock is scheduled to play at the park at 8:00 followed by fireworks.

REPEAL INTERNATIONAL BUILDING CODE:

Travis motioned to repeal ordinance 17 section 2 adopting the uniform building code and in its place adopting the Idaho state edition of the International Building Code with the exception that non-

occupied detached buildings less than 600 sq. ft. will not need to be inspected by a building inspector. Mark seconded and voting was all in favor.

AMEND BUDGET:

Travis motioned to amend the General budget and allow for spending an amount not to exceed \$20,000 for remodeling the City Office building. Mark seconded and voting was all in favor.

BUILDING PERMIT:

Gus Hansen did not show up to the meeting.

APPROVE MINUTES:

Sarah motioned to approve the June meeting minutes. Travis seconded and voting was all in favor.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

- The 2nd East road got graded north of Cundick's house.
- Mayor Garner would like to talk about cleaning out the city office building to start the remodel at the August meeting.
- Still no word on the Jay Fannesbeck water right hearing.

DELINQUENT WATER BILLS:

Delinquent water bills were discussed. Glen will give overdue accounts shut off notices.

BUDGET REVIEW:

The clerk gave a quarterly budget review. General and Water budgets are both looking good.

APPROVE JUNE BILLS:

The council passed around the June bills. Mark motioned to approve them. Sarah seconded and the voting was all in favor.

PUBLIC COMMENT:

Magdalena suggested having a magician at the Pioneer celebration next year and she said she might like to be a vendor next year.

Sarah motioned to adjourn the meeting. Travis seconded and the meeting adjourned at 8:28 p.m.
