APPROVE MINUTES:

Travis motioned to approve the May council minutes. Sarah seconded and the motion passed.

WATER PROJECT UPDATE:

- Steven Wood gave an update on the water project. The well is operating at 400-410 gallons per minute. Everything is working well. The punch list is completed. DWA did a good job.
- The replacement fire hydrant installs were started this week.
- The pipe has been purchased for the looping projects. They were able to get 8" and 6" pipe and there was only a 29-cent difference in price for the 8" pipe.
- Steven presented an engineering amendment to the council to design the water line looping and a new PRV station. Ryan moved that the council approve Amendment #3. Sarah seconded and the voting was in favor.
- With the addition of the PRV station, the line looping, the survey monuments, and the GIS mapping, there is a need to explain the changes to the master plan to DEQ. Sarah motioned to adopt the update to the water facilities plan and Scott seconded. Voting was in favor.
- The survey work will be starting in the next couple of weeks.
- The PRV station is almost all designed.

WALT POVEY – QUIT CLAIM DEED:

Walt Povey has two parcels of land and one has a city easement running through it. Parcel 1 had an easement but the city vacated the easement in 2004 and it was recorded. The easement through Parcel 2 was supposed to be vacated but it was never recorded and Walt asked the council if they would vacate their easement in Parcel 2. The council had no problems with doing that and asked Sharon to talk to Steve Fuller to see what needs to be done.

-Mayor Garner is waiting for information about federal Covid money that the city is supposed to be getting from the state.
