APPROVE MINUTES:

Travis motioned to approve the November regular council minutes and the November workshop minutes. Sarah seconded and the motion passed.

WATER PROJECT UPDATE:

The pre-construction meeting with DWA went well. They provided all their bonding and insurance information. They will begin December 7. Steve handed out an amendment for the council to look over with a bid for GIS mapping services. Sunrise would house the data on their servers and we would get two licenses – one for viewers and one for an editor. Weston City would own all the data and we would be able to export the file if we ever wanted to. Steve told the council that they could attach pictures of the project going on now and they could scan any documents into the system including operating manuals, and they could map fire hydrants. Travis asked that he look into the price of adding survey seals that could be monumented in at every intersection. Ryan motioned to approve Amendment 2 from Sunrise Engineering and Sarah seconded. Voting was all in favor.

CHRISTMAS:

Janie has got two sets of wagons pulled by horses. Santa will ride in the wagon and kids will run treats up to every house. She will do the traditional bags of peanuts and candy and is also looking into giving every household a loaf of Old Grist Mill bread. Texas Roadhouse donated the peanuts. She is trying to get enough helpers to pass out the goodies. The Weston 2nd Ward Young Women will help fill the bags for a service project. We will meet at 5:30 on December 23 to start.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

We are working on getting a new city truck. The used vehicle market is tough right now because there's not a lot of inventory and trucks are expensive right now. They will keep looking. We need a minimum 1-ton truck preferably with a solid front axle.

BUSINESS LICENSES:

Ryan excused himself from voting on Woodward's business licenses because he is a son-in-law of Van Woodward. Scott motioned to approve a renewal of Woodward's Country Store business license and

beer license. Travis seconded and Scott voted in favor. Travis also motioned to approve the renewal of any business license as long as they send payment by the end of the year to the clerk. Sarah seconded and the voting was in favor.

PERMITS FOR ROAD CROSSINGS AND RIGHT OF WAYS:

Sarah shared what the county does and what the fees are for a county permit to cut the road. We will want to incorporate something like the county does while we are codifying our ordinances. They county charges the individual applying for the permit for repairing the road because the county has resources to do the work. As a city with limited resources, we will want to put the burden of restoring the road on the applicant and have them warranty the work for a year.

APPROVE NOVEMBER BILLS:

The bills were passed around. Travis motioned to approve the November bills. Ryan seconded and the motion passed.

DELINQUENT WATER BILLS:

Late water bills were discussed. We are going to keep the same 10% late fee rate but we are going to start charging it at 2 months and the interest will be compounded. If we are tougher on our fees, maybe the amount of delinquent water bills will go down.

Ryan motioned to adjourn the meeting and Sarah seconded. The meeting adjourned at 9:06 p.m.
