The meeting started with Steven Wood looking over a priority list that he and Glen worked on as to what the most important priorities are for the water system to spend any remaining money left over in our loan. Glen's first priority is to relocate the existing generator at the lower pump house to the wells. The advantage of this would it would provide site protection if something should happen to the new well house and springs. Next, he would like to replace 12 fire hydrants in addition to the 4 that have already been budgeted to be replaced. He would like a new PRV station so all of the water flowing to the east side of town does not need to pass through one station. If the water ever needs to be shut off on the east side of town it provides another way for water to get there so all of the east side doesn't need to be shut off. Ideally, he would like a full vault station but a cheaper option that would save \$10,000-\$15,000 would be a concrete manhole station. The third priority is to add additional piping through different sections of town to provide a looped system and increase fire flow at certain fire hydrants. All of these options were looked at and Steven asked the council to make a quick decision on the fire hydrants because there is a long lead time. The council will decide on at least that portion in the next meeting.

They also talked with Steven about the city's water system supporting a large subdivision that has talked about wanting to come to Weston. Steven told the council the existing infrastructure could not support a subdivision of the size that is being proposed. The tank is not big enough and there is not enough water for peak day demand. The developers would need to build a new tank and get a new source of water. Shannon advised that if the council wants to limit multi-family dwellings, they can limit that through zoning.

The council went through the water section of the ordinances with Shannon.

We will meet again on Thursday the 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:00 p.m. to try to go through more ordinances.

The meeting adjourned at 8:45 p.m.
